

FY2025 Nichibunken Academic Encouragement Award: Recommendation Guidelines

1. Aim

The International Research Center for Japanese Studies (Nichibunken) established the Nichibunken Academic Encouragement Award in 2023 with the aim of nurturing junior researchers who are based outside Japan and who are likely to lead internationalization of Japanese Studies through comprehensive research in the field. The Award is designed to honor outstanding researches in Japanese Studies conducted from an international perspective, as well as to subsidize the future development of such researches and foster the next generation of researchers.

2. Eligibility

Eligible candidates are limited to doctoral students recommended by overseas institutions holding academic exchange agreements with Nichibunken or International member institutions (Full member) of the Consortium for Global Japanese Studies.

- (1) Applicants must aspire to lead in the internationalization of Japanese Studies through comprehensive research on Japan in the humanities and social sciences, and aims to produce doctoral dissertations that explore the diversity and multifaceted nature of Japanese history, society, or culture.
- (2) Applicants can be of any nationality.
- (3) Applicants already enrolled in or affiliated with another institution within Japan at the time of application are ineligible.
- (4) Applicants must be able to arrive in Japan on or after April 1, 2025 and depart on or before March 31, 2026. The length of stay shall be up to 90 days including the dates of arrival and departure. Please note that arrival and departure during the year-end and New Year period (December 29-January 3) are not permitted.

*Candidates may request their desired research period from among the designated below.

However, Nichibunken shall have final say over period granted.

- (A) 90 days within the period from April 1, 2025 to August 31, 2025
- (B) 90 days within the period from August 1, 2025 and December 28, 2025
- (C) 90 days within the period from December 1, 2025 and March 31, 2026

3. Recommendation of Candidates

Only one candidate may be recommended by the President or Faculty/Graduate School Dean of any eligible institution. Recommendations by other parties, or self-recommendations, are not accepted.

4. Overview of Support for Awardees

The following support will be provided:

- (1) Up to 90 days pursuing research at Nichibunken, to include airfare (economy class), accommodation and per diem allowances in accordance with the regulations of the National Institutes for the Humanities. No salary will be paid.
- (2) Free use of the Visiting Research Fellows' Room, Library, computers, and other facilities at Nichibunken.
- (3) Accommodation at Nichibunken House (fees apply).
- (4) A faculty member to mentor and assist research (please inform Nichibunken if you have a preferred faculty member).
- (5) Assistance to any awardee whose nationality requires them to apply for a visa.

5. Application Procedure (documents may be written in English or Japanese; however, the research proposal must be in Japanese)

Send the following documents by e-mail to the address in article 9 below.

Documents to be submitted by recommender:

- Recommendation Form

Documents to be submitted by candidate:

- Application Form
- Outline of research activities to date
- Research proposal (write about the research you plan to undertake at Nichibunken in about 2,000 Japanese characters (kana and kanji))
- One of the following: Master's thesis, published academic research paper, a paper presented at an international academic conference, or some equivalent written work
- Proof of current enrollment in a doctoral program

6. Number of Awardees

Up to three awardees will be selected each year, in principle. If fewer, or no candidates are considered

suitable, fewer or no awards shall be made.

7. Determination of Awardees

Selection is made by the Nichibunken Academic Encouragement Awards Selection Committee.

8. Selection and Notification of Outcomes

Around February 2025, the Nichibunken Academic Encouragement Awards Selection Committee shall select the successful candidates and issue notification to their home institution .

- 4) Awardees may be requested to cooperate in future activities of the Consortium for Global Japanese Studies promoted by Nichibunken.

Nichibunken shall dispose of such information responsibly when the selection process is complete.

- 6) Nichibunken does not have Overseas Travel and the Disaster Compensation Insurances.
Awardees will be requested to enroll in these insurances at their own expense before arrival in Japan.
