

Guidelines for Authors

Japan Review is an interdisciplinary, peer-reviewed journal published by the International Research Center for Japanese Studies (Nichibun), Kyoto. See the journal's Aims and Scope for more information about its focus and peer-review policy.

Please note that *Japan Review* only publishes manuscripts in English.

Submit your manuscripts by email or via file-sharing software to the Editorial Team (jr-editors AT nichibun.ac.jp, replacing AT with the @ mark).

Preparing Your Paper

Structure

Your manuscript should be compiled in the following order: title; abstract; keywords; main text introduction; body of the article; conclusion; references; and appendices. Any tables or figures should be supplied as separate files, along with their captions. The manuscript should be fully anonymized, and references to the author's other work kept to a minimum.

Please also submit a Cover Page as a separate file, providing the title, abstract and keywords of the article, any acknowledgements, together with full contact details and a brief bio (c. 150 words).

Word Limits

The journal does not exercise a strict word limit, but a typical research article should not greatly exceed 10,000 words in length, inclusive of the abstract, footnotes, references, and captions.

Please include a word count for your manuscript when you make your submission.

Style Guidelines

Consult the latest version of the [Japan Review Style Guide](#) when preparing your manuscript.

Japan Review draws on the *Chicago Manual of Style*, and follows the conventions of American English usage.

The journal advocates the sparing use of Japanese characters for names, words and phrases.

Double quotation marks should be used. Single quotation marks should only be used for quotations within a quotation.

Japan Review uses a modified author-date system. References for citations should be placed in footnotes (not in-text). Footnote callout numbers should be placed at the end of a sentence; one number per sentence.

A “References” section at the end of the manuscript should list all sources that are cited, in alphabetical order of author/editor. The reference list should be in accordance with the [*Chicago Manual of Style*](#), although note *Japan Review* does not require place of publication.
